Match, Reach, and Safety

- *Match school* an academic institution that will meet you where you are academically. You will encounter a rigorous academic environment and do well.
- *Reach school* an institution that will push you to rise to a high caliber of academic standards. You will have to be more committed and passionate than you have been before to be successful
- *Safety school* the academic institution that you were able to easily be admitted to. You will be challenged here academically and will have to stay focused to do well



Strategizing to find you match school

- •Use this checklist or formula to find the best fit school for you:
- Academics + Environment + Needs/Interests = Best School for YOU

- •Research school admissions standards
- Start applying to colleges early

- Every college or university has a set amount of standards that they use when evaluating student applications and thus deciding who gets admitted, deferred, or denied.

Affordability

- Some schools are more affordable than others.
- Money does play a factor in which school thousands of students choose to attend every year.
- Be sure that when you receive your financial aid award letters consider which college is the better deal financially for you.
- The school that is willing to alleviate the most costs of attendance tends to be the most supportive in a multitude of other ways for their students
